Note from the Principal

As it has been stated several times, our theme for this year is "Leave your footprint in the world. Leave your fingerprint on its souls". This is a two-prong message and hopefully spins two prong goals for all of us.

You have placed your faith in St. James School to academically prepare your children to be ready to take their places in the world. Our pledge is to teach them to think, to gather and process information, to discern and to apply that knowledge. Our pledge, too, is to lead them to discover, to explore, and to learn, so that they will achieve in their ultimate careers and leave their mark, their footprint in the world...and, with God's blessings, make a difference. The first prong message prepares them for what they will do in life.

This is an important and a grave responsibility for an educational institution, but they can get such skills at any excellent school. St. James School offers more – the second prong of the message. Your children are here so that they can understand and experience their affective ability and know they can make a difference in someone's life, even people they will probably never meet. Those are the fingerprints on souls, and they

don't fade on the lives they touch. The second prong prepares them for the kind of person they will become in life.

None of us need to be reminded when September roles around each year what happened to us all in 2001. It was a terrible time for everyone. On September 11, 2001, the community of St. Tames and neighboring parishes were hard hit with the devastation that took place in New York City. Parents, relatives, neighbors, friends were lost in the blaze and smoke that engulfed the heel of Manhattan. With their lives gone, ours were changed forever.

As we strove to resurrect ourselves in the aftermath, St. Hillary School, in Fairlawn, Ohio reached its hand across the miles to let us know that others cared and shared our pain. Family members played a part in linking the two schools together. In an effort to be connected to us, their fingers created a comfort quilt, hand stitched with care and love... trying to heal hearts that were broken, trying to tell us they cared. We never forgot that kindness.

In 2005, Hurricane Katrina struck. Our missionminded kids wanted to help. Student initiated, they raised almost \$1700 dollars through bake sales, bracelet sales, ribbon sales, dress down days, and even setting up lemonade and cookie stands at home. We adopted a school, again through relative intervention, who had taken in over 125 displaced students and sent our donations. We sent more than money, though. We decided to send our comfort quilt to help cloak the newly broken hearts...hearts we would probably never meet but with a promise that tomorrow would be better. There was only one instruction that accompanied the quilt. 'Keep it for as long as you like, but pass it on to another school someday that finds itself in time of need and in the need of understanding hearts."

That quilt took on a life and story of its own over nine years. In October, 2006, tragedy struck the Nickel Mines Amish School. Our comfort quilt left, Louisiana and traveled to Pennsylvania where it hung at the Bart Township Fire Company, as a sign of support and, once again, understanding hearts reaching out in a gesture of kindness and compassion.

The quilt did not stay long among the Amish. In April, 2007, a shooting rampage took place at Virginia Tech that claimed the lives of 32 people. Amish families boarded buses and personally presented the quilt to the VT community offering comfort and peace.

In February 2008, our quilt was on the move



again to Northern Illinois University where a shooting had taken the lives of five students. Now it hangs in the University of Alabama in the wake of yet another campus mourning. Sadly we know it probably won't stay here but will continue its journey bringing comfort to those who need it.

So many years later the quilt lives on in testimony that out of tragedy can emerge understanding and compassion from others who yearn to give comfort and touch the heart of others... leave our finger-prints on souls. So many have been affected by the initial act of kindness from the students at St. Hillary School to us. And how many more have been moved by our gesture of passing a simple piece of material to a school community suffering terrible loss? May it continue to cloak them and those yet to be in need, so they feel the prayers of others who had suffered likewise.


