Approximately \$6500 has been raised so far in pledges and sponsors, and runners have started to sign up. There will be electronic chip timing this year, allowing for age categories and prizes. There will be a bike for each boy and girl winner age 14 and under in the 5K. The After-Party will take place at Celtic Cottage in Long Branch. John Rafferty will provide live music, and there will be basket raffles.

Terra Nova Testing Week is moving along smoothly. A reminder that children need a good night's sleep and healthy breakfast in the morning to be prepared and energetic for the tests.

New families are still touring the school and shadowing students for the day.

Summer camps will start up the last week in June. Letters will be going home to Preschool Parents to gauge interest in a Preschool Camp to be offered in the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of June.

Summer renovations are scheduled to begin on Thursday, June 30. The floors will be redone on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> floors, as well as retiling in those classrooms that have not already been done. The preschool carpets will come up and those floors will be refinished as well.

Confirmation is next Wednesday, March 16. The students have been busy preparing and practicing.

Re-registration is moving along, although there is still some paperwork outstanding. A late fee of \$50 will now be incurred, and at another later date it will increase to \$100. The reason for the late fee is to encourage families to get their paperwork in so there is a better idea of the budget in order to plan for staff contracts, salaries, etc.
