A lthough it is the opposite end of the school year, I thought I would share with you my Graduation remarks to the Class of 2009, with a little adaptation. I think it defines what our ultimate goals are for our students whether they have just arrived, are half way through their journey, or about to complete it.

Chocolate milk...doesn't everyone enjoy it? When I was a child I loved chocolate milk...Yoo-Hoo, Bosco, Hershey, Brooklyn's own Fox's U-bet...it didn't make any difference. Just a peg below drinking it, I loved making it. I would take the container, turn it upside down, and raising my arm up high and then down low, I would watch the syrup slowly, ever so slowly descend in a steady stream into the glass of milk. All the while, a thick residue of delightful ooze built up at the bottom of the glass. Then came the fun

#### PTA Speaker Night

Did you ever wonder why our children get so many vaccines? Are you concerned about the flu shot, the H1N1 vaccine and side effects of each? Did you think we didn't need immunizations after age 15?

To answer these questions and more, the PTA sponsored our first Speaker Night of the year on October 14<sup>th</sup>. We were

pleased to have Drs. Joel and Laura Jannone and Dr. Stephanie Reynolds here to speak about immunizations and influenza. Dr. Joel Jannone is a board certified Doctor of Internal Medicine, who has been a physician in Lacey Township for 24 years and the Lacey Twp. Schools Physician for 20 years. Dr. Laura Jannone, EdD, RN. CSN Doctorate in Nursing Education, has been in nursing for 33 years, a school nurse for 10 years. Dr. Reynolds is a board certified Physician, Doctor of Emergency Medicine at Riverview Medical Center. She is also the mother of two St. James students.

Drs. Jannone explained the target disease of each vaccine regularly given to our children, as well as when each vaccine is given and potential risks. They also listed vaccinations that should be given to adults and at which age. They explained that New Jersey requires the greatest number of vaccinations for our children, and that there are reasons that a child can be exempted from receiving specific vaccines.

Dr. Reynolds spoke about the symptoms and severity of both the regular (or seasonal) influenza and the H1N1 (or swine) flu. She offered precautions that should be taken by everyone to avoid the flu, especially effective hand washing, and actions that one should take after symptoms are present to reduce these as well as to prevent further spread of the flu. Finally, she spoke about the seasonal flu shot and its risks as well as the H1N1 flu shot and its target population and risks.

SJS Nurse Marie Lehmann was instrumental in arranging these speakers and the PTA would like to offer her our special thanks.
